How to get to SIGNAL IDUNA PARK by car



from the North:

take the autobahn A1 until intersection Dortmund-Unna, then change to A44/B1 towards Dortmund



from the East:

take the autobahn A2 until intersection Dortmund-Nordost, then change to B236 towards Schwerte, then switch to B1 in the direction of Dortmund



from the South:

via A45 until intersection Dortmund-Süd, then change to B54 towards Dortmund



from the West:

take the A40/B1 towards Dortmund

Please note: For every BVB home game, many thousands of people will be heading towards SIGNAL IDUNA PARK (especially when it is sold out, which is generally the case). This means that anyone who wants to travel by car should make sure to arrange enough time for the journey.

When there is no match at SIGNAL IDUNA PARK, however, you can drive right up to the stadium's "front door" where you will find ample parking spots. In exceptional circumstances (i.e: other events in the stadium or the Westfalenhallen) the Strobelallee will be closed, street signs and road patrol will then inform you about alternatives.

Anyone who wants to use GPS for travelling should type the following destination address into his or her navigation system: SIGNAL IDUNA PARK

Parking

Over 10,000 paid parking spaces are available around SIGNAL IDUNA PARK and the Messezentrum Westfalenhallen.

More parking facilities can be found at the TU Dortmund University at the price of €2. From the campus, free shuttle buses go to and from the stadium (both before and after the game).

You can find the campus of TU Dortmund University here: Otto-Hahn-Straße, A45 exit "Eichlinghofen", then B1 exit "Oespel/Kley".



How to get to SIGNAL IDUNA PARK with public transport

On matchdays, Dortmund's transport provider DSW21 offers special trains to the stadium. Furthermore, the underground line U45 additionally stops at the station "Stadion" which is only a stone's throw from SIGNAL IDUNA PARK.

Apart from the special train, you can of course also use regular public transport. So if you want to go to SIGNAL IDUNA PARK on or out of matchdays, you can take...

... the train:

Dortmund Hauptbahnhof (central station) is the hub for travelling with "Deutsche Bahn", the biggest station in the Ruhr valley, and usually the first destination for those travelling from elsewhere. SIGNAL IDUNA PARK also has its own train station.

... the underground:

With the lines U45 or U46 you can go to "Westfalenhallen". Here you will already see the stadium, and it is then only a 5-minute walk to SIGNAL IDUNA PARK. You can also travel via line U42 (towards Hombruch) to "Theodor-Fliedner-Heim", from where you can reach the stadium in about 7 minutes.

... the bus:

The bus line 450 also stops at "Westfalenhallen".
